About Truro

Truro is the shire town of Colchester County, and is known throughout the Maritimes as the “Hub of Nova Scotia.”

The Mi'kmaq name for the Truro area, “Wagobagitik” (meaning “end of the water’s flow”), was shortened by Acadian settlers to “Cobequid” who arrived in the area in the early 1700s. By 1727 they established a small village near the present downtown site of Truro known as “Vil Bois Brule” (village in the burnt wood). Many Acadians in this region left in the Acadian Exodus which preceded the Expulsion of the Acadians in 1755. The town was resettled in 1761 by Presbyterians of predominantly Ulster Scottish origin who came from Ireland via New England. It is named after the city of Truro in Cornwall, England.

Truro has been an important provincial town for centuries. Its roots can be traced back to its early days as an agricultural centre through the agricultural campus of Dalhousie University – formerly known as the Nova Scotia Agricultural College, where many previous NA conventions were held.

Truro and environs are home to 47,500 friendly and hardworking Nova Scotians. Downtown you’ll find a variety of small businesses, including retail and restaurants.

Many figures from the town’s past are featured in over 40 tree sculptures which were carved in tree trunks after Truro lost most of its elm trees to Dutch elm disease in the 1990s.

Parts of the Berlin Wall are located near the agricultural campus of Dalhousie University.

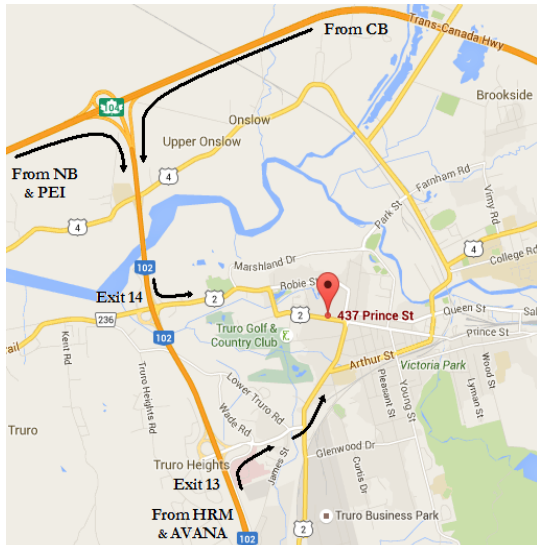
